State College Sewer Construction (Phase B of the Newhope Sewer Replacement Project)

Background

The Orange County Sanitation District (OCSD) is a public agency that provides wastewater collection, treatment and recycling services for approximately 2.5 million people in central and northwest Orange County. OCSD operates two facilities — Reclamation Plant No. 1 in Fountain Valley and Treatment Plant No. 2 in Huntington Beach — and treat an average of 185 million gallons of wastewater each day.

What is this project?

This project will increase the size of the Newhope Trunk Sewer on State College Blvd. It will install a larger diameter sewer pipeline to replace the existing pipeline. This phase of the project will replace four miles of sewer, in total, over seven miles of sewer pipe will be replaced.

Why is the project needed?

The sewer line is being upsized to allow for the abandonment of the Yorba Linda Pump Station and to make more water available for recycling. Once completed, 8 million gallons per day of sewer flows will be diverted to OCSD's Plant No. 1 for treatment before being sent to the Groundwater Replenishment System.

Where is the work taking place?

This project takes place along State College Blvd. from the 91 freeway to Orangewood Avenue in the City of Anaheim (south of Angel Stadium). This is known as Phase B. Phase A of the project was in Fullerton from Yorba Linda Blvd. to the 91 freeway.

When is this project scheduled?

Construction of Phase B is scheduled to begin in summer 2018 and last approximately two and a half years. Most work is expected to take place Monday to Friday, during daytime hours. However, some portions of the work will require night and weekend work and extended hours. Notifications will be distributed and posted on our website with specific locations and schedule as the dates approach. Phase A was completed in summer 2017.

What impacts can be anticipated?

OCSD is working diligently on this project to ensure every possible measure is taken to minimize public impacts. There may be periodic traffic delays and stretches of State College Boulevard may have traffic restrictions reducing the number of open lanes down to two. There may be elevated noise levels, vibration, and other related impacts. However, mitigation measures will be put in place to ensure compliance with City ordinances as well as to minimize the impacts to our neighbors.
