Newhope Sewer Replacement

Background

The Orange County Sanitation District (OCSD) is a public agency that provides wastewater collection, treatment and recycling services for approximately 2.5 million people in central and northwest Orange County. OCSD operates two facilities— Reclamation Plant No. 1 in Fountain Valley and Treatment Plant No. 2 in Huntington Beach—and treat an average of 185 million gallons of wastewater each day.

What is this project?

This project will increase the size of the Newhope-Placentia Trunk Sewer. It will install a larger diameter sewer pipeline to replace the existing pipeline. In total, over 7 miles of sewer pipe will be replaced.

Why is the project needed?

The aging infrastructure is over 50 years old and nearing the end of its service life. It is not large enough to handle the projected wastewater flows and needs to be replaced. Expanding the size of the sewer pipeline will increase system reliability, reduce the risk of sewer spills, and preserve public health. This project will extend the useful life of the sewer pipes another 50 years.

Where is the work taking place?

There will be two phases to this project: Phase A and Phase B. Phase A will take place along State College Boulevard, from Yorba Linda Boulevard in the City of Fullerton to south of the 91 Freeway. Phase B will take place along State College Boulevard, from south of the 91 Freeway to Orangewood Avenue in the City of Anaheim (south of Angel Stadium). Phase B also includes a segment from Craig Regional Park to Associated Road and E. Bastanchury Road in the City of Fullerton.

When is the project scheduled?

Phase A construction is scheduled to begin April 2016 and last approximately 18 months. Most work is expected to take place Monday to Friday, during daytime hours. Some portions of the work will require night and weekend work and extended hours. Notifications will be distributed and posted on our website with specific locations and schedule as the dates approach. Phase B construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in Winter 2018.

What impacts can be expected?

OCSD is working diligently on this project to ensure every possible measure is taken to minimize public impacts. There may be periodic traffic delays and stretches of State College Boulevard may have traffic restrictions reducing the number of travel lanes. There may be elevated noise levels, vibration, and other related impacts. However, mitigation measures will be put in place to ensure compliance with City ordinances as well as minimize the impacts to our neighbors.
